Methodology	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Census usually resident population count: count of all people who usually live in New Zealand and are present in New Zealand on a given census night (excludes visitors from overseas and residents who are temporarily overseas on census night) - In March 2006, Banks Peninsula District Council amalgamated with the Christchurch City Council. For the purposes of time series, Banks Peninsula data for 2001 and 2006 have been incorporated under Christchurch City
Time period and time scale	Census; from 2001 onwards
Population coverage	National
Measures of frequency	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Percentage of change in population in New Zealand - Percentage of change in population in New Zealand by TA
Limitations of indicator	In November 2010, Auckland Council became a unitary authority, when Auckland regional council area and seven territorial authority areas amalgamated.
Limitations of data source	Because of the 2011 Canterbury earthquake, the 2011 was postponed until 2013. The gap between the current census (2013) and the previous one (2006) is therefore seven years. Change in the data between 2006 and 2013 may thus be greater than the usual five-year gap between censuses.
