Non-melanoma skin cancer deaths by DHB

This factsheet presents statistics about deaths from skin cancers other than melanoma in New Zealand, at the DHB level. Skin cancer is a persisting issue in New Zealand, as New Zealand has higher than average UV levels compared with other countries at similar latitudes.

Key facts




In 2014–18, rates were higher in the Wairarapa and South Canterbury District Health Boards (DHBs) compared to the national rate.

Rates appear elevated in Wairarapa and South Cantebury DHBs

In 2014–18, Wairarapa and South Canterbury district health boards had NMSC mortality rates that were higher than the national rate (figure 1).
